

Garden Report: July 2020

Volunteers:

o Extension Volunteers are back on a limited basis. Academic volunteers lined up for fall.

Monitoring:

- CoCoRHaS rain gauge installed. Seeking help from the neighborhood for daily monitoring. The garden successfully soaked up rainfall within short periods of time.
- Soil: Contacted Watershed Outreach Associate Jennifer Jones about establishing soil testing. She connected us with ACES/Crop Sciences professor Dr. Andrew Margenot, who is a soil scientist. He provided information and also offered to let us use his lab equipment to measure infiltration.

• Observations of note:

- July blooms: New Jersey Tea, Buttonbush, Red Twig Dogwood, Black Cohosh, Swamp Milkweed, Butterfly Weed, Purple Poppy Mallow, Tall Bellflower, Pale Purple Coneflower, Purple Coneflower, Rozanne Geranium, Cardinal Flower, Smooth Phlox, Grey-Headed Coneflower, Orange Coneflower, Royal Catchfly, and Rosin Weed. Summer 2020 Plant Collection and Zoom backgrounds are featured on the website.
- o **Build it and they will come:** Seeing multitudes of Monarch caterpillars.
