Light the Night 2020 – Planning meeting

7/29/2020

Not Present: Jeff Yockey

- Meeting started with the discussion that everyone should have access to the LTN drive –
 SP will do that
- BI asked if we should have the event this year or not considering the pandemic
- CH and SSD said that if we take precautions we can have an outdoor event
 - CH said that she had recently organized an event and we can do that same for LTN
 - This event was indoors
 - For this event there were 6 volunteers on day 1, 5 on day 2, and 3-4 on day 3.
 - Must get a COVID Safety Plan ready for approval from the CU Public Health District
 - Challenges: Keeping the masks on at all time during the event
 - Being outside is key, masks must be mandatory, hand-sanitizers
 - Provide masks and gloves
- BL risk is less, if the event is outside
- BL said that having an official event may not be a very good PR thing. He wondered if we can do distributions at COVID test centers around the campus.
- SSD said that we don't want to impede the function of the Testing Centers. We don't want anything going on at these testing sites.
- CH pointed out that there are outdoor events happening like farmer's market everyday
- SSD agreed that we could do something similar to that
- BI wondered if we can have distribution at Illini Union or somewhere like that (buildings that are open)
 - SSD said that Illini Union and other locations are short staffed and we do not want to add to their workload
- MW said that we should plan for the Mass Distribution and Installation, if it seems like we cannot do a mass event then will look for other options
 - MW asked for The Bike Project's perspective
- CH said that we must set a timeline for volunteers etc.
 - Enter at one point
 - Volunteers must have gloves, masks, wipes
 - Ask the attendees to stay 6-feet away

- LW said that she will reach out to people who wrote the plan/protocol for events that were presented at CUPHD and how they worked out
- BL said that we may not have the option of Mass Install, and that we should plan for a disperse program as well
- BI said that his availability is a lot less since he is working from home.
 - TBP is only working maybe 1 day a week for a few hours
- If TBP is not available, then we will think of someone else
- SP will ask Steve Breitwieser if we can advertise the event
- JM asked if we can do the event in Spring semester
- CH said that there could be more people on bikes now, since they are reluctant to ride the MTD. Spring semester could be the Plan B
- BI said that the prices at Bikes wholesale market has gone up drastically
 - The blinky lights (durable ones) have gone from \$5 to \$15
 - If few do installation of the silicone ones only then the mass install may not be effective
- GL asked if he could bring tablets to the event for Bike Census
 - They will have a table at certain locations
 - o They can have a couple of volunteers distribute the lights as well
- JB said that
 - We cannot get any blinky lights
 - We don't have any lights
 - TBP voted down the idea of Light the Night this year because of light availability and health safety reasons
- CH said that we may have to get new volunteers from other student organizations
- About the funding
 - MW confirmed that UIUC still has funding for LTN
 - LW, BL, and CH also confirmed that Urbana, Champaign, and MTD can provide funds as well
- BI said that in case we don't have a mass installation event, silicone lights are fine and we do not need the durable ones
- MW asked for CCRPC's involvement
 - GL said that he would be interested in providing tablets and work with Census people
- Follow up meeting in the next couple of weeks
- SP will send a doodle poll for the follow up meeting in 2 weeks.
