- Light the Night Planning Team

How it came to be?

- Bike to Work Day (BTWD) is normally the main event during Bike Month in May
- Light the Night (LTN) the main bike event during the fall semester in September
 - 14th Annual event organized in 2021
- BTWD was combined with Light the Night for 2021
- Bike Month Planning team and LTN Planning team decided to hold it on the same day
- BTWD in the morning and LTN in the evening

Bike to Work Day 2021

What do we do?

- Acknowledge and thank regular bicycle commuters and encourage and invite first-time riders
- Use publicity to raise driver awareness
- Survey the participants their biking preferences and what would encourage them as well as other first time riders
- Cyclists visit welcoming stations on their morning commute for snacks, giveaways, educational materials, and meet with bike advocates as well as local planners and others involved in bike infrastructure and enforcement



Bike to Work Day 2021 - highlights

Champaign-Urbana hosted the first C-U Bike to Work (and School) Day on May 4, 2010

- Annual event since 2010
- More than 800 pre-registered to participate and nearly 150 walk-ins during BTWD 2021 (highest to date)
- 16 welcoming stations across Champaign County, including 9 on-campus









Light the Night 2021

Light the Night is an annual free bicycle light giveaway

First Light the Night event was held in 2008

- Organized every year in September
- In 2021, installed nearly 750 light sets (front and rear)
- Had nearly 40 volunteers

Educate the public that state law in Illinois requires bicycles to have a front light and rear reflector, at minimum, when riding at night

Three campus locations

- Potential other activities




Recommendation
