- Overview of objectives
  - Objective 1: Biodiversity Plan
    - A graduate student intern is working on this with Lisa
      - Over the spring and into the summer, the intern talked to 40 people about their thoughts on this project, currently compiling the info
      - Planning this to be done by August
    - Lisa and the intern will share a draft of their work with the team for review and feedback
  - o Objective 2: Coordinated Rainwater Management
    - Campus Landscape Master Plan completed
      - The plan does not specifically require the use of native plants, but encourages it as a policy
        - The list of allowable plants for the campus is already developed and Brent Luis is keeping that updated
    - Don't yet have the funding and the movement for on-campus overarching rainwater management plan
      - By getting input from the completed landscape master plan, the team can participate in a larger scale rainwater management plan process
    - Stacy will be meeting with the MS4 team on Tuesday
      - MS4 Permit has to do with where wastewater goes in the community includes people involved in the management of wastewater and management of the MS4 Permit
      - Stacy will give a short presentation on iCAP and talk about a project related to collecting info about green infrastructure and populating database of green infrastructure locations that will get into an online system that can be used multiple parts of Illinois
        - Will provide an update on this at the iCAP Portal
    - The Champaign County Storm Water Working Group will have a conference
      - Increasing the use of rainfall information in developing storm water
      - management a great recommendation for the conference!
  - Objective 3: Environmental Justice Plan
    - Need to meet again with Government Relation
  - Objective 4: Local Sustainability Issues

- Think of this objective as looking back to the priorities that were developed originally on the resilience commitment before the Resilience iCAP team got formed (?)
- Should be an initiative coming from the whole university, not just a small group

   increases credibility
- By next month, team members can create new ideas on what taking leadership on addressing sustainability challenges can look like – opportunity for recommendations!!
