The Education iCAP Team should clarify what the specific actions are needed for this recommendation, in relationship to the LAS 291/292 class. We understand Kate teaches this class and is moving forward at this time, so what specifically would you like to see happen elsewhere?

We also would like to know more about the which aspects of sustainability are you interested in having developed – is it carbon cost of travel or carbon emissions associated with travel. Which groups of study abroad are you focused on (at this time)? For example are you talking about students who are living abroad for a semester/year (residential study abroad), or students who are taking a single course with a one-week or one-month excursion (faculty-led study abroad)?

The focus could also be about the carbon cost of travel, or it could be more of a deeper dive into sustainability issues and cultural perspectives in the area that is being visited. These are very different topics and require different approaches for integration.

Additionally, there are similar efforts occurring in other colleges, such as ACES study abroad. iSEE will help connect you to the efforts underway at ACES, to learn from each other and potentially collaborate.
