The Sustainable Food Event would cater vegan food from the Red Herring and invite speakers to discuss topics revolving around food. The goal of the event is to educate attendees on the importance of eating sustainably and how to incorporate the decision into their day-to-day lives. Wednesday Talks would occur at Bevier Cafe with the goal of educating the public about various environmental topics through a speaker presentation. This is a continuation of last year's Tuesday Talks, which successfully engaged students and prompted networking between UIUC students and the broader community with speakers representing local environmental organizations such as Prairie Rivers Network and the Citizens Utility Board. Funding from the SSC would go toward one free Bevier Cafe meal for each speaker and a free meal for the first five attendees of all three events.

Although the project does not have direct environmental benefits, it indirectly increases environmental stewardship at UIUC by educating students about sustainability and prompting them to think about and hopefully change their habits.
