Through exhibitions, namely a biannual fashion show, events, and educational initiatives, CFE strives to raise awareness about the environmental and social impact of fashion while fostering a community of like-minded individuals dedicated to creating positive change.

CFE.7 is the seventh rendition of Circular Fashion Expo, an educational and design project focused on sustainability and circularity in the fashion industry. This year's event is a combination of educational workshops to promote zero-waste design, up-cycling, and textile reuse, and culminates in a fashion show presenting the work of multiple student organizations and designers, all made from sustainably sourced materials; either second-hand or from the models' closets. The executive board of CFE is responsible for putting on these workshops and the fashion show, and do so by constantly communicating with one another and the other runway organizations, planning ahead, with several positions to manage different aspects of the project, including a set director, artistic director, runway director, and two co-lead organizers. With this being the seventh CFE, there is a history of successful workshops and runways in the past that have laid a groundwork for how to execute this project, and coupled with our current exec's creativity and work ethic, we are confident that CFE.7 will be a success.


The project is a presentation of art and design by students, for students. With around 150-200 models, designers, and makeup artists, and crew putting on the runway itself, all students at the University of Illinois, CFE is a place for students to present their artistry and design to the world. The audience of the event consists of 250+ members, of which at least 90% are students attending the fashion show. They are direct audience members to the designs walking the runway and the statements they are making, but also to the speeches given by several organizations before runways, including the mission of Students for Environmental Concerns and Dressember. CFE also puts on several education workshops, including a photography workshop, a screen printing workshop, and an up cycling/mending workshop, with an estimated attendance of at least 50 students not in attendance at the fashion show at the end of the semester. These workshops seek to further educate on CFEs mission of circular and sustainable fashion, while connecting students directly with the art that we create.

Circular Fashion Expo seeks to empower artists and audience members alike in displaying a fashion show that shares messages of its own, and displays impressive workmanship and craft, while all being done sustainably. All the materials sourced for the outfits must be second-hand or from the models' closets already, and the runway is all the more impressive for being able to address the issue of textile waste and overproduction in the fashion industry while still being a statement in and of its own. Sustainably sourced fashion is also more economical, with second hand fabrics and clothing being cheaper than buying brand new, and up cycling cutting costs of purchasing completely while transforming into something completely new. Fashion can be beautiful and well constructed while still existing sustainably and economically, and that is the mission of CFE.

How does your project promote and increase environmental stewardship at UIUC?*

CFE calls on the fashion industry to be more sustainably minded in general. Fashion and textile waste currently take up at least 7% of landfill space in the world, and much of that is due to the fast fashion industry, and the constant cycling of styles. CFE seeks to flip the script, and show that art can still be created in a sustainable way, and we hope that that is what the 300+ audience members and workshop attendees of our projects are able to take away. There is no exact measurement of waste saved, however, all runway organizations are required to acquire their materials sustainably, and we hope that the echoes of our message will go on to inspire more and more people to shop second hand, or refrain from buying new all together.
